Greene County to hold National **Day of Prayer**

BEAVERCREEK -Beavercreek's Christian Life Center will host "Celebrate Freedom" May 3, a kick-off event for the National Day of Prayer on May 7.

Greene County coordinator for the National Day of Prayer Kay Bond said the event is a way to come together to remember the nation's foundation.

"Our event is really trying to encourage the community to remember our heritage and where our freedom came from in America," she said. "And just how important it is to unite together in prayer for our nation and as well as our heritage, especially for this younger generation.'

Bond, also the Greene **County Prayer Coali**tion director, said she approached the Christian Life Center about hosting the kick-off event that Bond and her team had been praying for the past few years.

"I just felt strongly we needed something to pull our community leaders as well as the pastors together as well as the citizens to come together, not just for a prayer event," Bond said.

Former Ohio House of Representatives member Seth Morgan will speak at the event. Morgan said he is planning to draw from principles in his book "It's About Liberty, Stupid!", focusing on the role of the indisaid. "And certainly as a person of faith personally, I think it's incumbent upon all people of faith to be seeking God as the scripture commands us to – to pray for our leaders, to certainly submit to the authority – it's just authority – and to understand our role that we play in the American form of government and how that fits with our civil authority that's over us today.'

Bond said she expects the event to draw a crowd of about 250 to 300 individuals. The May 3 event, which is free and open to the public, will be held 6:30-8 p.m. at 1321 Research Park Blvd. Greene County's National Day of Prayer event will be held 6:30-7:30 p.m. May 7 for all to attend at the 9/11 Memorial on North Fairfield Road.

Bond said the National Day of Prayer outlines seven areas of prayer: family, church, education, media, military, business and government.

Though the National Day of Prayer wasn't set as the first Thursday of every May until 1988, with Reagan's signature, Bond said praying for the nation goes back to America's roots.

"The founders of this nation, they weren't all Christian, but they respected that there was a God, and they knew that God brought America together," Bond said.
